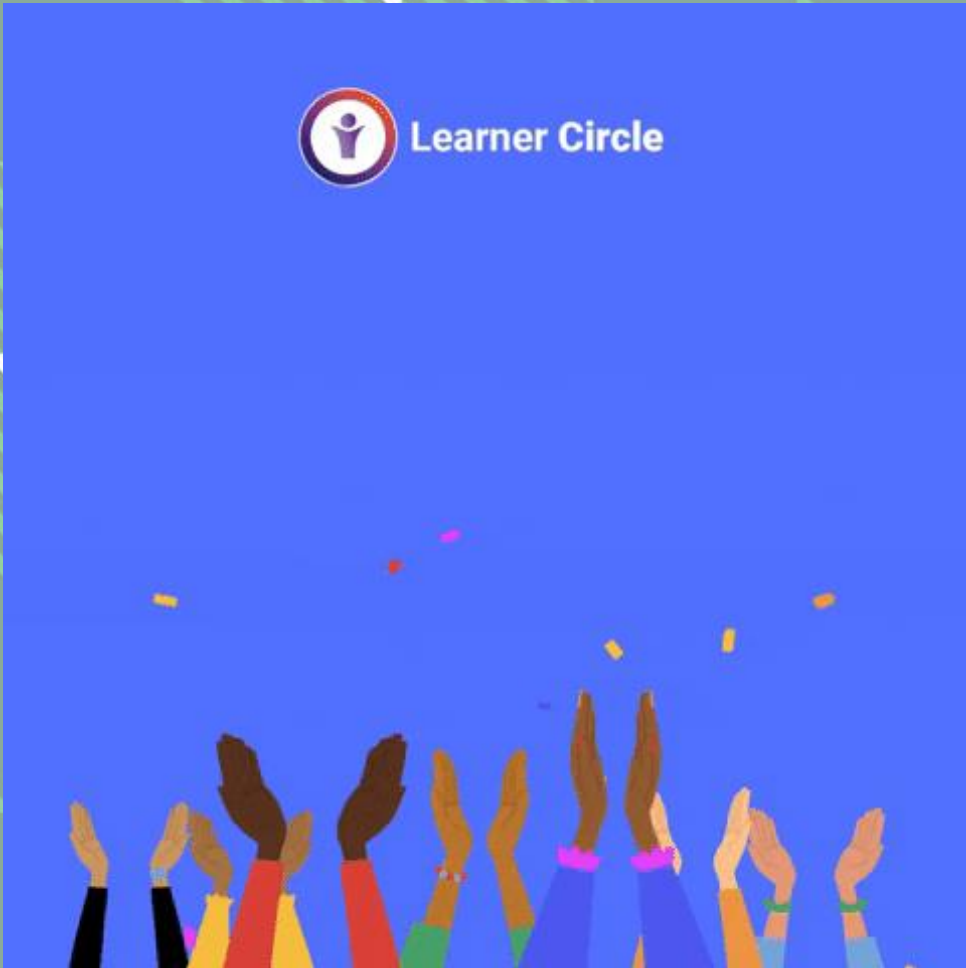


Monday, 22nd – Friday, 26th January

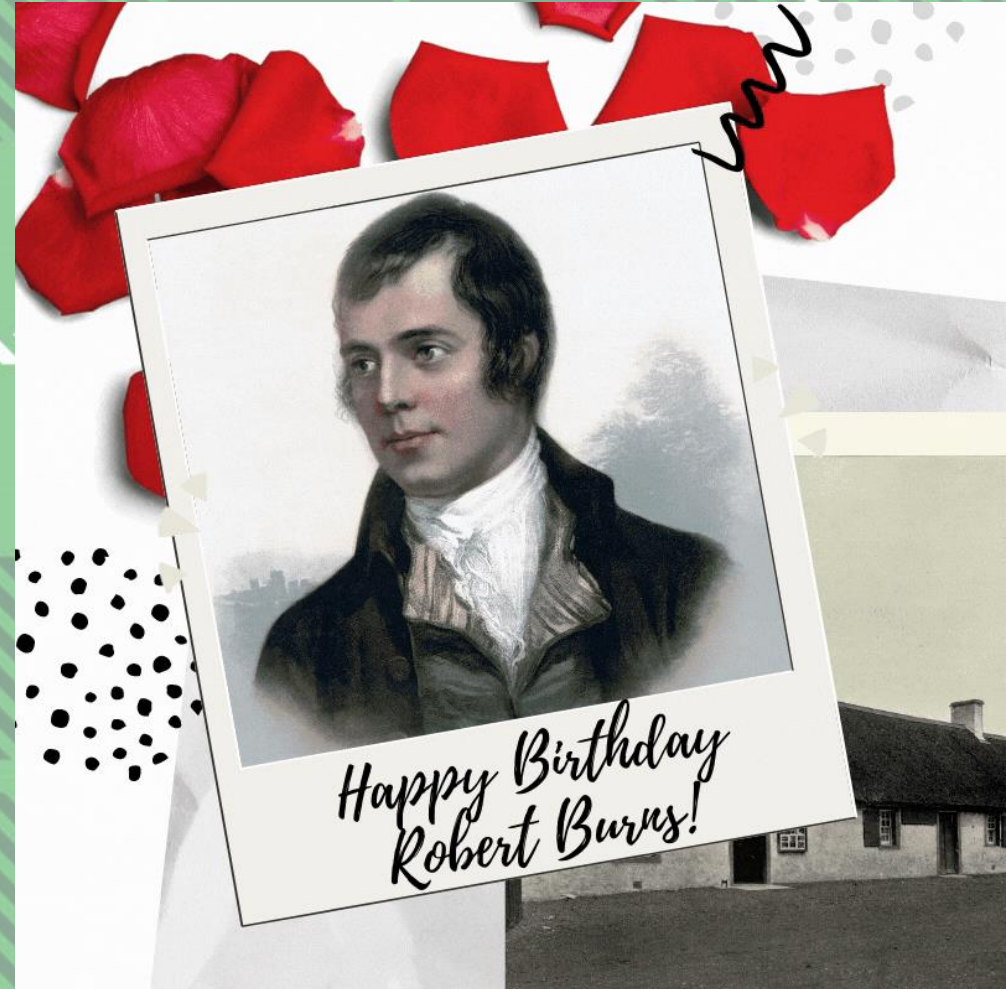
